Faculty recognized a need to design materials to clarify the expected standards of academic integrity and citation. Faculty meeting minutes are attached. (03/31/2017)</p> <p>Meaningful Changes: While formal rating of the skill was higher than expected, internship supervisors continue to emphasize the importance of students having excellent oral and written communication skills. Faculty will review assignments to make sure that students have sufficient opportunity to improve their written and communication skills in both the on-campus and online programs. Faculty will specifically look at ways to improve students' communication skills on the phone as some supervisors have commented in exit interviews that these skills are lacking. (06/30/2016)</p>

This increased the stress of students attending the residency. It also delayed some students from attending a residency program and ultimately completing a partially-online degree. Faculty and eCampus staff recognized the need to improve advising and provide information about the residency early in student careers. Faculty and staff developed email correspondence and a program contract to remedy this situation. Email correspondence and program contract are attached. (03/31/2017)</p> <hr/> <p>Meaningful Changes: While formal rating of the skills was higher than expected, alumni continue to emphasize the importance of learning the latest updates on the substantive law and legal technology. Faculty will review course content and assignments to make sure that the students have sufficient</p>
